The MSHA investigation found no physical or environmental hazards at the worksite. The autopsy report indicated that the cause of death was arteriosclerotic coronary artery disease with contributing causes of hypertensive cardiovascular disease and diabetes mellitus. The deceased had a history of hypertension, diabetes mellitus, and a coronary artery stent had been placed 2009. An examination was negative for bodily trauma and the toxicology test results were negative for drugs and alcohol.

Based on the autopsy findings and the results of MSHA's investigation, the committee members concluded that died from natural causes and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
