

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| In a unanimous decision, the Fatality Review Committee has determined that the death of should not be charged to the mining industry. a 78 year old trespasser, entered restricted mine property and traveled to a remote site adjacent to the mine refuse area. He was cutting down a tree for firewood when it fell, striking him on the back of the head. He was discovered by hunters while still alive but he died at a local hospital due to his injuries. |
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| The death certificate indicated that the manner of death was accidental and was due to blunt force impact to the back of the head and a fractured skull. did not have permission to be on the mine property and had no affiliation with the mine operator. |
| MSHA's investigation found that was not performing mine related work nor was his death caused by mining activity or equipment. The members of the committee concluded that his death should not be charged to the mining industry. |
