In a unanimous decision, the Fatality Review Committee has determined that the death of should not be charged to the mining industry.

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The should not be charge

The death certificate indicated that the manner of death was natural and that the cause of death was a myocardial infarction. An autopsy was not performed. An MSHA investigation failed to identify any physical or environmental hazards.

Based on the findings of the death certificate and the MSHA investigation, the committee members concluded that died due to natural causes and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
