death of	should not be charged to the mining industry.
Mr.	a 49 year old contractor dump truck driver, dumped off a load of
excavated	material in the stockpile yard and then began shoveling dirt under his
truck tires f	or traction. He was seen several minutes later on the ground at the side
of his truck	. He was unresponsive and not breathing. CPR was begun at the site and
Mr.	

The death certificate indicated that the manner of death was natural and that the cause of death was an acute cardiac syndrome. He had a history of diabetes and elevated lipids. The MSHA investigation failed to identify any contributory physical or environmental hazards.

Based on the findings of the death certificate and the MSHA investigation, the committee members concluded that Mr died due to natural causes and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
