medical personnel found that his sp	beech was slurred, h	ne had left arm and leg
weakness, and complained of a hea	adache. Mr.	was transported by life flight to
a regional hospital where he was pronounced dead the following day.		
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The death certificate indicates that the manner of death was natural and the cause of death was an intracranial hemorrhage due to a hypertensive emergency. No autopsy was performed. MSHA's investigation did not identify any environmental or physical conditions that could have caused Mr. Pavlich's death.

Based on these findings, the Committee concludes that Mr. at a 's death was due to natural causes and should not be charged to the mining industry.
