The certificate of death indicated that the manner of death was natural and that the cause was atherosclerotic and hypertensive cardiovascular disease. The autopsy report listed the cause of death to be toxic effects of methamphetamine with atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease as a significant contributory condition. The manner of death was listed as natural.

MSHA's investigation was conducted between August 03, 2015 and August 25, 2015. No physical or environmental factors that could have contributed to the death were identified.

Based on these findings, the committee members concluded that Mr. died due to natural causes and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
