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In a unanimous decision, the Chargeability Review Committee has determined that the death of the second should not be charged to the mining industry. A 22-year old trespasser, was one of several persons who illegally accessed an abandoned area of the mine to swim and fish. 50-foot highwall into a water filled pit and did not resurface. Rescue divers recovered the victim, but he was later declared dead at a local hospital.

The death certificate listed accidental drowning as the cause of death. MSHA's investigation determined was not employed by or affiliated with the mine operator.

Based on these findings, the committee members concluded that **death** death should not be charged to the mining industry.
