In a unani	mous decision, the Chargeability Review Committee has determined that
the death	of should not be charged to the mining
industry.	Mr. a 19-year old trespasser, was one of three persons that illegally
accessed	the mine to swim in an abandoned water-filled pit on the mine property.
Mr.	went underwater 60 feet from the shore and failed to resurface.

The death certificate listed accidental drowning as the cause of death. MSHA's investigation was conducted between August 17, 2015 and August 19, 2015. No physical or environmental factors that could have contributed to the death were identified.

Based on these findings, the committee members concluded that Mr. and a death should not be charged to the mining industry.
