In a unanimo	ous decision, the Chargeability Review Committee has determined that
the death of	should not be charged to the mining industry.
Mr.	a 57-year old heavy equipment operator, was tramming an excavator
when he rad	ioed the plant operator to say that he was feeling ill and needed assistance
He then com	plained of chest pain when co-workers found him in the excavator cab.
He was trans	sported to a local hospital, and died while awaiting open-heart surgery.

MSHA's investigation was conducted between October 26, 2015 and October 27, 2015. No physical or environmental factors that could have contributed to the death were identified. The death certificate listed the cause of death as myocardial infarction as a result of coronary artery disease. An autopsy was not performed.

Based on these findings, the committee members concluded that Mr. and a should not be charged to the mining industry.
