a 57 year-old contra	tor employee, was riding as a passenger in a maintenance truck	
when he slumped o	er onto the driver of the vehicle. Mr was unresponsive ar	าด
unconscious. Effort	to resuscitate him failed, and he was declared dead at the scene	€
by the coroner.		

MSHA's investigation was conducted between December 20, 2015 and February 08, 2016. No physical or environmental factors that could have contributed to the death were identified. The death certificate indicated that the manner of death was natural, and that the cause of death was sudden cardiac death. An autopsy was not performed.

Based on these findings, the committee members concluded that Mr. died due to natural causes, and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
