I have reviewed the investigative reports in the death of determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. A 59 year-old contractor truck driver, was part of a two-person team delivering bulk acid (cyanide) to the mine. The deceased was resting in the sleeper compartment and failed to respond when the other driver signaled him that they had arrived at the mine site. The other driver parked the truck and pulled back the curtain to the sleeper compartment to awaken him. He was not breathing and efforts to resuscitate him failed.		

MSHA's investigation was conducted between January 27, 2016 and February 01, 2016. No physical or environmental factors that could have contributed to the death were identified. The death certificate and autopsy indicated that the manner of death was natural and that the cause of death was atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease.

Based on these findings, I have determined that **executed** died due to natural causes and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
