I have reviewed the investigative reports in the death of **sector sector** and determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. **Sector**, a 43 year-old filter helper, arrived for work but collapsed and fell to the ground as he was walking to his work station from the change house. He was found unresponsive by a co-worker and CPR was initiated. **Sector** was transported to a local hospital where he was pronounced dead.

MSHA's investigation was conducted between January 19, 2016 and March 08, 2016. No physical or environmental factors that could have contributed to the death were identified. The death certificate and the autopsy report identified the cause of death as acute myocardial infarction due to severe coronary arteriosclerosis.

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Based on these findings, I have determined that **set the set of** died due to natural causes and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
