I have reviewed the investigative report in the death of and determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. On the day of the incident as 59 year old mechanic, started his lunch break at about 12:30 pm. At about 12:48 pm, wife contacted the mine office and reported that she got no response from her husband after he told her he was experiencing chest pain. A coworker went to check on and found him unresponsive. Efforts by coworkers and EMS to revive the were unsuccessful. He was pronounced dead at a local hospital at 2:08 pm.

The autopsy report and death certificate indicate the manner of death is natural and list the immediate cause of death as arteriosclerotic and hypertensive cardiovascular disease. MSHA's investigation did not identify any environmental or physical factors that could have contributed to the death.

Based on the death certificate and MSHA's investigation, I have determined that the death of was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
