I have reviewed the investigative report in the death of and determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. a 14 year old trespasser, and another teenager entered the pit to wade in the water. The two young men were in shallow water when they reached one point where the surviving teen indicated that it felt like the side of the ridge fell off. The two teenagers went underwater and didn't come back up.		
The deceased was later found by a paramedic in approximately seven feet of water. The medical examiner's report indicates the cause of death was drowning.		
Based on the medical examiner's report and MSHA's investigation, I have determined that the death of was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
