Dear Mr. Bunn:

You are hereby notified that the Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) has determined that a Pattern of Violations exists at the Fork Creek No. 1 Mine, Mine ID 46-08763. The determination was made on the basis of violations of mandatory health or safety standards at the mine that could significantly and substantially (S&S) contribute to the cause and effect of safety or health hazards pursuant to § 104(e) of the Mine Act, as described in the attached Notice.

On September 16, 2013, MSHA began its screening of mines for a Pattern of Violations pursuant to 30 C.F.R. § 104 and MSHA's *Pattern of Violations Screening Criteria (2013)*. Following the screening, MSHA conducted an audit of the injury and employment data at Fork Creek No. 1 Mine. Based on the audit and the resultant corrected severity measure, the screening revealed that for the 12-month period ending August 31, 2013, Fork Creek No. 1 Mine met MSHA's screening criteria for a pattern of violations. MSHA carefully considered if there are sufficient mitigating circumstances that would make issuance of this POV notice inappropriate, or if there are mitigating circumstances that could justify a decision to postpone the issuance of this POV notice to reevaluate conditions in the mine. MSHA determined that there are insufficient mitigating circumstances to justify not issuing or delaying issuance, of this POV Notice.

If upon any inspection within 90 days after issuance of this Notice, MSHA finds any violation of a mandatory health or safety standard that could significantly and substantially contribute to the cause and effect of a coal or other mine safety or health hazard, MSHA shall issue an order requiring the operator to cause all persons in the area affected by such violation, except those persons referred to in Section 104(c) of the Mine Act, to be withdrawn from, and to be prohibited from entering such area until an Authorized Representative of the Secretary determines that such violation has been abated. This POV notice will terminate if, upon an inspection of the entire mine, MSHA finds no S&S violations of mandatory safety and health standards. The enclosed Notice of Pattern of Violations shall remain posted at Fork Creek No. 1 Mine until it is terminated by an Authorized Representative of the Secretary in accordance with 30 C.F.R. § 104.4. You may request an inspection of the entire mine or portion of the mine in order to satisfy the requirements for terminating this Notice at any time.

If upon any inspection within 90 days after issuance of this Notice, an Authorized Representative of the Secretary finds any violation of a mandatory health or safety standard that could significantly and substantially contribute to the cause and effect of a coal or other mine safety or health hazard, the Authorized Representative shall issue an order requiring the operator to cause all persons in the area affected by such violation, except those persons referred to in Section 104(c) of the Mine Act, to be withdrawn
