In a unanimous decision, the Fatality Review Committee has determined that the death
of should not be charged to the mining industry. MSHA's
investigation revealed that was a mechanic for Wyoming Machinery
Company, a contracting company that was performing work at the Black Thunder
Mine. had finished working on an electrical problem on a haulage truck and
was sitting in his pickup truck when he became ill. He called a co-worker by radio and
asked for assistance. A mine employee transported to a first aid station. From
there, he was transported by ambulance to a hospital in Gillette, Wyoming, where he
was pronounced dead. MSHA investigators determined that at the time he became ill
was not working with or in contact with any electrical equipment. The
electrical problem had worked on was an 8-volt circuit that did not pose a
hazard to The Coroner's Report indicated that the cause of death was fatal
cardiac arrhythmia secondary to occlusive coronary artery atherosclerosis and prior
myocardial infarction.

Based on the Coroner's Report and the results of MSHA's investigation, the committee members concluded that died from natural causes and his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
