In a unanimous decision, the Fatality Review Committee has determined that the death
of should not be charged to the mining industry. MSHA's
investigation revealed that body was found in a pond at the Sandy Flats
mine. He was not a mine employee and was not authorized to be on mine property.
had left a letter to his brother and an audio recording describing his plan to
kill himself. A Sargeant with the local Sheriff's Department stated that
carried out the plan described in the recording.
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Based on the results of MSHA's investigation, the committee members concluded that committed suicide and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
