In a unanimous decision, the Fatality Review Committee has determined that the death	
of should	not be charged to the mining industry. The
deceased, a 36 year old trespasser, drove his pick-up truck over a quarry highwall to a	
depth of 250 ft. The deceased made a failed first attempt to drive over a berm and then	
backed up his vehicle some 80 ft to gain speed on his second attempt.	
had worked at the mine as a janitor five years previously but did work at the	
site at the time of his death. Investigations conducted by MSHA and the Massachusetts	
State Police Detective Unit concluded that	committed suicide.

Based on the State Police and MSHA investigation reports the Fatality Review committee concluded that this case involved a trespasser suicide and should not be charged to the mining industry.
