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had a history of hypertension and diabetes. The death certificate indicated that the manner of death was natural and was caused by ischemic and hypertensive heart disease with diabetes as a contributing factor. The toxicology screen was negative. The autopsy report indicated that the deceased had cardiomegaly and moderate to marked coronary atherosclerosis.

Based on the findings of the death certificate and autopsy report the committee members concluded that died from natural causes and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
