In a unanimous decision, the Fatality Review Committee has determined that the death of **Sector Committee** has bould not be charged to the mining industry. **Sector Committee** and **Sector Committee** has been also be charged to the mining industry. **Sector Committee** has a sector truck driver, was found unresponsive in the cab of his haul truck. He was transported by ambulance to a local hospital where he was pronounced dead.

The death certificate indicated that the cause of death was cardiac arrhythmia. Hypertensive heart disease was listed as an underlying cause and morbid obesity was listed as a significant medical condition. An autopsy was not performed. MSHA's investigation did not identify any physical or environmental factors that could have contributed to the death.

Based on the findings of the death certificate and the MSHA investigation, the committee members concluded that **based on the death due to natural causes and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.**
