In a unanimous decision, the Fatality Review Committee has determined that the death of should not be charged to the mining industry. Should not be charged to t

The death certificate indicated that the manner of death was natural. Both the death certificate and the autopsy report indicated that the cause of death was coronary artery atherosclerosis. The autopsy found a 98% blockage of two coronary arteries. MSHA's investigation did not identify any environmental or physical hazards that could have contributed to the death.

Based on the findings of the death certificate, the autopsy report and the MSHA Investigation, the committee members concluded that died due to natural causes and that his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
