**Decision:** Not chargeable

I have reviewed the investigative report in the death of determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. Mr. a 57 year old surface utility miner, was loading plastic water pipe onto a utility trailer with a co-worker when he complained of pain in his chest. He sat down to rest for a few minutes but when he stood up again he collapsed. Emergency personnel arrived and applied a defibrillator. Vital signs were not detected. The deceased was transported to the hospital where he was pronounced dead.

The death certificate indicated that the cause of death was "cardiac arrest due to diabetes mellitus insulin dependent and hypertension." The manner of death was natural. No autopsy was performed. MSHA's investigation did not identify any environmental or physical factors that could have contributed to the death.

Based on the death certificate and MSHA's investigation, I have determined that the death of Mr. was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
