I have reviewed the investigative report in the death of determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. A 46-year-old pumper, was working with a co-worker to prepare a new location for a pump installation. Complained of chest pain while walking toward the mantrip to eat lunch. He grabbed his chest and fell to the mine floor. Miners and emergency medical personnel performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation on the was transported to a local hospital where he was pronounced dead. The death certificate states that the manner of death was natural, and the primary cause of death myocardial infarction. The MSHA investigation did not identify any environmental or physical conditions that contributed to the death. Based on the death certificate and MSHA's investigation, I have determined that the death of was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
