I reviewed the investigative report in the death of the second and determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. **Mathematical age 53**, was the owner of He-Man Trucking and contracted to haul refuse at the mine. On the day of the incident, one of **Mathematical employees** found him slumped over the steering wheel of his pickup truck.

Emergency medical technicians at the mine performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation and attached an automated external defibrillator (which advised no shock be given). No pulse or vital signs were detected. An ambulance transported **cardiopulmonary** to the hospital where he was pronounced dead.

The death certificate stated that the immediate cause of death was "sudden death acute coronary syndrome." The MSHA investigation did not reveal any environmental or physical conditions that contributed to the death.

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Based on the death certificate and MSHA's investigation, I have determined that the death of **Sector** was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
