I reviewed the investigative report in the death of least and determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. Mr. Least a 57-year-old rock truck driver, was found unconscious on the ground near the mine office where he had been trimming weeds. Miners performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) until responding paramedics arrived. The paramedics continued CPR and transported Mr. Least to the hospital. However, he could not be resuscitated and was pronounced dead.

Both the autopsy report and death certificate state that the manner of death was natural, and that the immediate cause of death was sudden death due to underlying atherosclerotic cardiovascular artery disease. Cardiomegaly was listed on the autopsy report and death certificate as contributing to the death. The MSHA

investigation did not reveal any environmental or physical conditions that contributed to the death.

Based on the autopsy report, death certificate, and MSHA's investigation I determined that the death of Mr. was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
