The death certificate states that the manner of death was natural, and that the immediate cause of death was cardiac arrest and acute coronary syndrome. Hypertension was listed as an underlying cause of death and cigarette smoking as a			

significant contributing condition. The MSHA investigation did not reveal any environmental or physical conditions that contributed to the death.

Based on the death certificate and MSHA's investigation, I determined that the death of was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
