I reviewed the investigative report in the death of and determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. Mr. a 74-year-old scale operator was discovered by a co-worker on the floor of the scale house. was unresponsive, the co-worker performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and 911 was contacted. After contacting the doctor on staff, responding EMS personnel pronounced Mr. dead at the scene.

The death certificate states that the manner of death was natural, and that the immediate cause of death was multisystem organ failure. Dyslipidemia was listed as a contributing factor. The MSHA investigation did not reveal any environmental or physical conditions that contributed to the death.

Based on the death certificate and MSHA's investigation, I determined that the death of Mr. was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
