I reviewed the investigative report in the death of and determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. Mr. a 62-year-old over the road trucker, was found in his truck unresponsive and slumped over the steering wheel.			

The death certificate states that the manner of death was natural, and the immediate cause of death was acute myocardial infarction as a consequence of atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease. The MSHA investigation did not reveal any environmental or physical conditions that contributed to the death.

Miners performed cardiopulmonary resuscitation and administered three shocks from

an automated external defibrillator. Responding emergency medical personnel conducted resuscitative efforts at the mine and during transport to the emergency

room. However, Mr. was pronounced dead in the emergency room.

Based on the death certificate and MSHA's investigation, I determined that the death of Mr. was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
