The death certificate states that the manner of death was natural, and the immediate cause of death was complications of acute hemorrhaging pancreatitis. The autopsy is consistent with the death certificate. The MSHA investigation did not reveal any environmental or physical conditions that contributed to the death.

Based on the death certificate, autopsy, and MSHA's investigation I determined that the death of Mr. was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
