The death certificate states that the manner of death is accidental. The cause of death listed in the autopsy and the death certificate is crushing chest and liver trauma. The MSHA investigation did not reveal any environmental or physical factors that contributed to the death.

Based on the autopsy, death certificate, and MSHA's investigation, I determined that the death of Mr. was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
