I reviewed the investigative report in the death of and determined it should not be charged to the mining industry. Mr. a 62-year-old equipment and plant operator, was found collapsed on the shower house floor just prior to the start of his shift. Miners called 911 and attended to Mr. who at that time was sweating heavily and complaining of difficulty breathing. Mr. was transported by ambulance to the hospital, but died a short time later.			
The death certificate states that the manner of death was natural, and the immediate cause of death was cardiac arrhythmia as a consequence of hypoxia. The hospital records also indicated that Mr. had a history of atrial fibrillation, and was at risk for acute correspondence. The Mollah is			

for acute coronary syndrome. The MSHA investigation did not reveal any

environmental or physical conditions that contributed to the death.

Based on the death certificate and MSHA's investigation, I determined that the death of Mr. was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
