The death certificate lists the manner of death as natural, and states the immediate cause of death as atherosclerotic coronary artery disease. The autopsy was used to complete the death certificate, and lists the same cause of death.

The MSHA investigation did not reveal any environmental or physical conditions that contributed to the death.

Based on the death certificate, autopsy, and MSHA's investigation, I determined that the death of Mr. was not due to mine related work activities and should not be charged to the mining industry.
