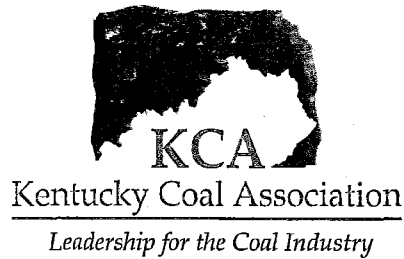

Re: RIN 1219-AB64; Proposed Rule for Lowering Miner's Exposure to Respirable Coal Mine Dust, including Continuous Personal Dust Monitors

Dear Sir or Madam:

The Kentucky Coal Association (KCA) is submitting a formal request to the Mine Safety and Health Administration (MSHA) to extend the comment period with the Proposed Rule: Lowering Miners' Exposure to Respirable Coal Mine Dust, Including Continuous Personal Dust Monitors, which was issued March 8, 2011. This extension would accompany similar efforts by other coal associations as well as the efforts of the National Mining Association (NMA).

KCA is voicing support of NMA's recent efforts seeking information, allotted under the Freedom of Information Act, in conjunction with MSHA's proposed rule. MSHA has partially denied efforts on acquiring specified data, in which NMA has decided to formally appeal this denial to the Solicitor of Labor.

KCA is formally requesting the comment period shall not close until NMA's appeal is ruled upon, and a sixty-day extension is granted once all documents are received to ensure adequate time for review and comment.
