General Comment

How does this make mining safer?

Change from \$97 to \$121 Charging more when:

- 1) The industry consensus is we are currently being overcharged for every approval.
- 2) The industry consensus is we are not getting what we pay for now. Approval times are ridiculously long. What use to take 3-4 weeks, now takes 9-12 months or longer.
- 3) This includes paying full price for minor changes on every approval. Every update or change is treated like a new approval and costs the same as a new approval. Discrepancies on updating are rarely anything new on the approvals.
- 4) It is often very obvious when the MSHA inspector is not at all familiar with the equipment under review. We are in essence, paying to train the MSHA inspectors.
- 5) Is MSHA trying to be a more profitable government agency?

Charging for internal quality control activities:

- 1) Unethical, MSHA could charge for unknown and exaggerated paperwork evaluation(s). Who will watch over MSHA to verify there is no favoritism, retaliation, or harassment?
- 2) I cannot charge my venders separately for this; they could not include it in their prices. This is usually considered overhead.
