Repeal ozone regulation from the Obama Administration could cost \$270 billion per year and place millions of jobs at risk. Total compliance costs could measure in the trillions of dollars. This would be the most expensive regulation ever imposed on the American public This is because they are likely to include the shutdown, scrappage or modification of power plants, factories, heavy-duty vehicles, off-road vehicles and even passenger cars. As a result, the negative impacts of NAAQS for ground-level ozone will reverberate throughout the entire economy. barriers to energy production could severely limit economic growth and hinder the nation's manufacturing comeback. There are major gaps in data on compliance technologies and their costs EPA's past analysis. Loss of 4.3 million job equivalents per year and cost households \$2,040 annually; Increase industrial natural gas costs by an average of 52 percent and electricity costs by an average of 23 percent. Many are also concerned that these rules could threaten electricity reliability causing a major security threat to our nation. We need leaner Government, more productive, less regulation , get more bang for the buck.
