In 2011 there were 21 deaths at coal mines

10 MINERS DIED

who had 1 year or less experience performing the task they were doing when they were killed.

7 MINERS DIED

who had 1 year or less experience working at the mine.

BEST PRACTICES

- Perform COMPLETE and THOROUGH <u>New Miner</u> training.
- Perform COMPLETE and THOROUGH <u>Newly Employed Experienced Miner</u> training.
- Perform COMPLETE and THOROUGH <u>Hazard</u> training.
- Perform COMPLETE and THOROUGH <u>Task</u> training.
- Develop training plans with <u>ENERGIZING</u> teaching methods, <u>ENGAGING</u> course materials, and <u>EFFECTIVE</u> evaluation procedures.
- <u>Identify</u> the potential hazards associated with each activity, and <u>ensure</u> each miner is provided the needed training.
- Enhance training by increasing classroom instruction and using mentors.
- <u>Ask questions periodically</u> to measure <u>attentiveness</u> to, and <u>retention</u> of, specific material addressed in training sessions.
