30 CFR 75.223(b) requires that each unplanned roof fall and rib fall and coal or rock burst that occurs in the active workings shall be plotted on a mine map if it is above the anchorage zone where roof bolts are used, impairs ventilation, impedes passage of persons, causes miners to be withdrawn from the area affected or disrupts regular mining for more than one hour. Three coal bursts that occurred on March 7, March 10 and August 3, 2007 were not plotted on the map as required for this purpose. Each of these accidents impaired ventilation and disrupted regular mining for more than one hour. In addition, there were eight reportable roof falls of which only two were plotted on the required map.
